BASIC COURSES

COMPUTER LITERACY REQUIREMENT

If the student enters the University with a completed associate's or bachelor's degree, he/she is exempt. If the student takes only one Honors course in English, one in History, and one in Philosophy, then the student is exempt only from ENG 16.
