### GETTING STARTED

The key to a successful scholarship process is starting early. By beginning your search as soon as possible, your chances of receiving an award triple. One, you have more time to search and discover relevant scholarships and to narrow down your list to those scholarships you have the best chance of receiving. Two, you are able to apply for scholarships with early deadlines and to prioritize the order in which you should apply to scholarships. Three, you have sufficient time to thoroughly prepare for the process and thereby are able to submit a high quality application which can compete for each scholarship.

### TIPS

- a. Begin Early*
- b. Know what a scholarship is (check out: <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Scholarship>)*
- c. Discover how to find a good “match”*
- d. Get involved in L.I.U. activities – it matters*
- e. Keep studying – good grades are key to securing scholarships*
- f. Begin researching on your own using the books and websites below*
- g. Start your What Makes You Unique sheet*
- h. Complete the FAFSA, and get copies of your Tax Return and those of your parent(s)*
- i. Get to know your professors. You will need to use them as references*
- j. Be aware of scholarship scams. There should be NO fees to apply for a scholarship*
- k. Be persistent. There are many scholarships available!*
