8.0 COMPUTER LITERACY REQUIREMENT FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

The School of Business, Public Administration and Information Sciences adopted a revised computer literacy requirement for all its undergraduate students majoring in accounting, finance, management, marketing, and information systems. The policy excludes majors in computer science who have different requirements. The policy was approved by the faculty and becomes effective September 1, 2001.

All undergraduate students defined above are required to achieve computer literacy before graduation. Computer literacy is achieved by the successful completion of the course Computer Science 10 (three credits) or by the satisfactory completion of three credits from the Computer Science courses in the 9 series, which are one credit courses. (Page 62 of the Undergraduate Bulletin 2000-2002).

Any older policy that limited computer literacy to completion of Computer Science 8 and/or Computer Science 9B is no longer in force. The computer literacy definition is subject to revision pending the implementation of the Core Curriculum, which was approved by the faculty of the Brooklyn Campus in spring 2001.
